Goal

Cancer prevention has been associated with decreased rates of cancer incidence and increased survival. Despite this known fact, more effort and funds have been spent developing and implementing treatments for cancers rather than on research and development of cancer prevention modalities and strategies.

Our seminar seek to provide an avenue for bringing the academic researchers and the community providers who are all interested in cancer prevention together as first step in bridging the knowledge gap and to provide a means of disseminating research findings for practice application.

Educational Objectives

- Identify and assess major factors (lifestyle behaviors, nutrition, infections, sleep deprivation, physical inactivity) that contribute to cancer risk (*knowledge*, *competence*, *performance*);
- Describe and utilize various cancer testing and screening modalities to optimize patient care (knowledge, competence, performance, patient outcomes);
- Apply recent research and updates in cancer risk, early detection, and prevention in clinical practice to improve patient outcomes (*knowledge*, *competence*, *performance*, *patient outcomes*);
- Discuss the role of infections in cancer risk and the sue of vaccines in cancer prevention (knowledge)
