Developing a Changing Exhibition Gallery in the Main Museum Building The First Exhibit: A History of Angels Camp

The museum will display and interpret the history of Angels Camp and the Mother Lode region with thoughtful consideration of local families who established our community, as well as the other diverse groups who called this area home. For example, this exhibit will also tell about the immigration, life and impact of the Chinese, placing their story within the broader California Gold Rush history and specifically in Angels Camp, an exhibit which will later be displayed at the historic Sam Choy Store in downtown Angels Camp.

The Museum Foundation needs to raise \$11,000 for Phase One, the renovation of the gallery



in preparation for this important exhibition. The renovated gallery will include multi-media, custom metal wall panels, wood display cases and pedestals. Phase Two of this project is the design of the exhibit which will highlight historical artifacts from the Museum's extensive collections. Ultimately, this new exhibit will help our community to tell our story better, and the changing exhibit gallery will provide visitors a reason to return again and again.
