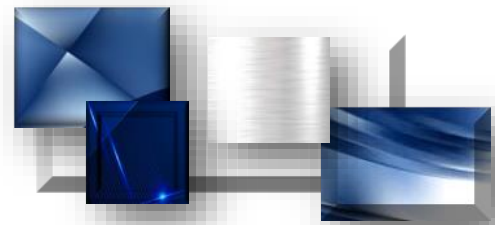

Ford's 2021 SEMA fleet shows off Maverick and Mustang Mach-E

Like many automakers, Ford brings a fleet of concept vehicles to the annual SEMA show to advertise their aftermarket potential. Scheduled for November 2-5, the 2021 SEMA show is no different. A Ford press release said more than 40 modified vehicles will be on display, but this year the emphasis seems to be on the newly launched 2022 Maverick compact pickup truck and the Mustang Mach-E electric crossover.

The modified Mavericks include one from Air Design USA, showing off the company's fender flares, door moldings, and tailgate appliqué. Based on the Maverick Lariat FX4, it also boasts a cat-back exhaust system, 1.5-inch lift kit, and 18-inch wheels wrapped in all-terrain tires.

Other Maverick builds include a lifeguard-themed truck built as part of an after school program of Oxnard (California) Union High School, in collaboration with the local police department. Tucci Hot Rods will show off a Maverick street truck, with 3D-printed fender flares, and a 3D-printed hood and front lip.

The EV contingent includes a Shelby Mustang Mach-E GT concept, applying the legendary Shelby name to the electric Mustang crossover. It gets a Shelby American carbon-fiber body kit, Shelby-tuned Ford MagneRide dampers, and 20-inch one-piece forged monoblock wheels with Michelin Pilot Sport EV tires.

Other Mach-E concepts include the Tijn Edition Mustang Mach-E California Route One—which sports bright orange paint, air suspension, and 22-inch Vossen ML-R1 wheels—and a modified Mach-E GT built for the Austin Hatcher Foundation for Pediatric Cancer. It will be run at the 2022 Bonneville Speed Week, targeting 200 mph, and will be auctioned off to benefit the foundation in 2023.

A couple of standard Mustangs will make SEMA appearance as well, based on the Mustang EcoBoost High Performance Package and Mustang GT Performance Package. The lineup also includes two modified Rangers—both with 6.0-inch lift kits.

Ford will also bring several F-150 concepts, based on the PowerBoost Hybrid, Hybrid Lariat, Tremor, and the redesigned F-150 Raptor. Concepts based on the F-250 Super Duty Tremor and F-450 Super Duty Platinum will be featured as well.

These builds are all making their public debuts at SEMA, but Ford will also display the Expedition Timberline Off-Grid concept that was first shown at Overland Expo East in Arlington, Virginia, earlier this month. Based on the 2022 Expedition Timberline, it has a rooftop tent and matching trailer full of gear for adventures in the wilderness.

2023 Ford Mustang rumors again point to Hybrid powertrains — even V8

Are you ready for a hot hybrid pony car?



Rumors of an electrified powertrain for the next-generation Mustang are swirling yet again after a former Ford engineer reportedly leaked his involvement in hybrid powertrain development for the pony car's forthcoming redesign, further bolstering expectations for more electrified models.

The most recent tip comes from LinkedIn (yet again). An eagle-eyed member of the *Mustang7G.com* forums spotted an engineer who reportedly listed experience working on two separate

powertrains marked as hybrids — one based on the 2.3-liter turbocharged four-cylinder found in the base car and EcoBoost high performance models, along with one based on what appears to be a variant of the Coyote V8.

Yeah, that's right. A V8 *hybrid*. While Ford has not yet paired a V8 with an electric motor in any production offerings, a pony car would certainly be a good fit for such a treatment. And this is not the first time we've heard rumors of a hybrid V8 from Ford; in fact, the last time we heard one, all-wheel drive was in the mix too.

The key to the whole formula is Ford's 10-speed automatic transmission. This gearbox was designed from the ground up to allow enough modularity for electrification, and it is utilized in virtually every rear-wheel-drive-based platform Ford offers. It's the gearbox that puts the F-150 PowerBoost Hybrid's 430 horsepower and 570 lb-feet of torque to the ground, but you'll also find it in the 2021 Ford Bronco, Ranger and Explorer, along with Lincoln's rear-drive offerings.

Not only can Ford hybridize this transmission pretty much across the board, but *Autoblog* has been told (but is unable to officially confirm) that hybrid powertrains have been prototyped for several of these models. The only thing we don't know for certain is whether (or when) Ford will green-light those projects. Stay tuned!

The Thanksgiving week will be upon you soon enough, but remember this ... it's a short week that ends with pie and shopping. You can do this.
