

The 271 high performance engine is professionally built with correct HiPo heads, solid liters, heavy duty rods, exhaust manifolds, 4V carburetor, correct open element

Please note, next year the Parks Ford Rise & Shine will be held on the second Saturday of each month. I would like to encourage members and friends to attend.



Award-Winning 1967 Shelby GT500 Fastback Headed To Auction

The Shelby Mustang lineup got a new player for the 1967 model year in the guise of the Shelby GT500, which was powered by a 428 cubic-inch V8 Police Interceptor engine fed by a pair of Holley 600-CFM carbs sitting atop a mid-rise aluminum intake. Either a four-speed manual or three-speed automatic transmission could be had.

The Shelby GT500 was more of a grand touring car, as opposed to the more





competitive focus of the 1965 and 1966 Shelby GT350 models. The GT500 could be optioned with power steering, power brakes with front discs, air conditioning, and a usable back seat. The hood was longer with a wider hood scoop, though still made from fiberglass. The outer headlights were supplemented by two inner headlights situated in the center of the grille. The tail section was made of fiberglass, as were the four side air scoops. Stiffer springs, an anti-roll bar, and Gabriel adjustable shocks rounded out the equipment list.



Our feature 1967 Shelby GT500, number 643, is one of forty-seven so equipped. It was the subject of a concours-level restoration that was completed in 2007. It is a multiple show winner, having captured concours wins at Shelby American Automobile Club 11 in Dearborn, Michigan, SAAC 12 in Charlotte, North Carolina and SAAC 13 in Santa Rosa, California as well as the Premier Division winner at SAAC 14 in Pocono, Pennsylvania and SAAC 15 in Dearborn, Michigan.

This Shelby GT500 shipped new to University Ford Sales in Champaign, Illinois. Finished in lustrous Dark Blue with white stripes, its 428 cube Police Interceptor is backed by a Toploader four -speed manual. It is equipped with power steering and power brakes with front discs. Chrome bumpers and trim look to have been re-plated. Stainless trim is polished to a brilliant fault. The Shelby Magstar five-spoke wheels are wrapped in raised white letter Goodyear bias plies.

Inside the Shelby GT500 is awash in Parchment upholstery. The seats show little sign of use, and the black carpet shows only some dusty heel prints. Racing harnesses hang from the factory rollbar. Trim finishes are in fine nick. The finishing touch is Carroll Shelby's autograph above the glovebox door.

The engine compartment of the Shelby GT500 is home to the 428 Police Interceptor rated at 355 horsepower. The engine bay has been well detailed, and appears to be quite correct. Eagle-eyed observers will note the VIN plate on the driver's side inner fender appears to have cracked at one of the rivets.

This handsome 1967 Shelby GT500 is accompanied by ownership and award history, a Marti Report, Shelby transfer document, Shelby invoice number 001936, customer sales tax return, owner's manual and dealership jacket, and the anti-freeze guarantee tag. It will cross the auction block at the Mecum Auctions Kissimmee, Florida sale January 6th-16th.

1967 Ford Mustang 'She Country Special' To Get Its Own Diecast Model

The Ford Mustang has had its fair share of special edition models over the years, from the more famous ones like the Mach 1 and Boss 302 down to more obscure models like the 1967 Ford Mustang "She Country Special." The brainchild of Ann Goodro, owner of Goodro Ford in Denver, Colorado, the She Country Special was designed to appeal to professional female customers. And now, this rare and interesting 1967 Ford Mustang special edition will be forever immortalized in die-case form, courtesy of GreenLight Collectibles.



GreenLight recently released a DECO sample image of its latest die-cast collectible, a 1:64 scale car that will be sold under item #30352. It's a truly cool little tribute to an obscure but interesting slice of pony car history, as Goodro became one of the only women to own and operate an automotive dealership in the 1960s when her husband, Bill, passed away in 1967. Goodro was determined to succeed in spite of the odds, and the She Country Special was one of the ways she intended to do so.

The 1967 Mustang She Country Special was available in a few unique colors, including Evening Orchid – the hue present on this die-cast model – as well as Autumn Smoke, Bermuda Sand, and Limelite Green. Each of these special edition pony cars also came with a special orchid corsage and an interior plaque. In total, just

48 She Country Special Mustangs were produced in coupe and convertible body styles, 12 of which were finished in Evening Orchard.

In addition to building and selling these special Mustangs, Goodro also created a special waiting room at the dealership specifically for women that featured nicer decor from a local furniture store. Ultimately, these changes worked, as Goodro Ford's sales rose 12 percent after Ann took over. Now, her story will rise to the forefront once again thanks to this cool little collectible.

In May of 2021 we took advantage of the warming weather and held our first Club Picnic. We had a pavilion reserved at the beautiful Lettuce Lake Park.


The club provided grilled hamburgers and hotdogs, and all the participants brought side dishes and desserts ... buffet style. And what a lot of food we had!
