Missionary Letter - August

Beloved brothers and ministry companions, we greet you fraternally. With all our hearts, we wish that our Heavenly Father continues to abundantly bless your lives, families, and ministries. We remain grateful to God for your prayers and for your lives, which are a part of ours.

We wanted to let you know that on July 25th, my wife and I returned to Chorrera after having our missionary gathering, which was a wonderful time to share with the other missionary families. She was able to stay with me until August 23rd. During this time, we had the opportunity to travel for a week to the Cordillera community and Puerto Milán, where we visited several families and provided counseling to some individuals. In Milán, we were able to share in a Sunday service and made several visits.

In Chorrera, we held a women's meeting and made several pastoral visits to different families. My wife helped with the children's ministry, alongside the teacher Diana, who is in charge of this work. We are concluding a training on diakonia next week with some brothers from Chorrera.

Regarding the land for the Christian church in Chorrera, we are grateful to God for having been able to pay off the full amount, and we have carried out several cleaning sessions at the site.

On a family level, we want to share that our son Samuel recently traveled to the city of Pamplona, Norte de Santander, to begin his university studies (he decided to study telecommunications engineering). It was a step of faith that we took with him, trusting that our God will provide for his support there. We are also praying and believing for a government scholarship for him; we submitted the application and will receive a response by November. Our daughter is continuing her studies satisfactorily in the tenth grade, and my wife is in her fifth semester of psychology, thanks to God.
