Missionary Letter - August

I. WORK AMONG THE COMMUNITIES AND IN THE AMAZON MISSIONS SCHOOL

1. Visits to Communities:

a. Handling logistics for the missionary trip: organizing materials, rehearsing children's lessons, and arranging evangelism and visits to some homes in the communities to be visited.

- Getting to know more about a pastoral missionary family (Hippie) in Tabatinga. It is a great honor to have gotten to know them more closely.



Prayer Requests

- For the final practicum of the missionaries in training, who will be out for two months: Pray for financial provision for transportation and food for the missionaries in training, for God's support in their teachings, for hearts to be transformed in unreached communities through the preaching of the Gospel, and for spiritual and physical protection for everyone.
- For new men and women who will be trained as intercultural workers next year, so that we can increasingly reach the goal of having every tribe, people, nation, and tongue worship Christ.
- For provision to sustain the Missions School each year and for new donors to join this ministry, so that we do not stop this missionary calling.
- For open doors to continue reaching further with the Gospel.
- For spiritual strength and God's support for missionary trips to more distant, difficult, and costly places, which are the farthest reaches of the jungle.
