Autism Communities is committed to fostering a culture of inclusion in neighborhoods across Long Island. We are dedicated to advocating for neurodiverse individuals in their desire to live independent and fulfilled lives.

In this spirit, we collaborate with area developers to provide access to affordable housing in which the individual can reside with the support of staff hired through their self directed budget. Our first residents moved into their homes in the Fall of 2020 and their success continues to inspire and motivate our commitment.

Today, 1 in 36 children are diagnosed with autism and 80% of adults with autism live at home and receive support from a family caregiver. Our mission and strategic plan are now more important than ever. We remain dedicated to emerging as a leader in the development of creative, sustainable housing options for neurodiverse individuals.




